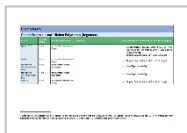
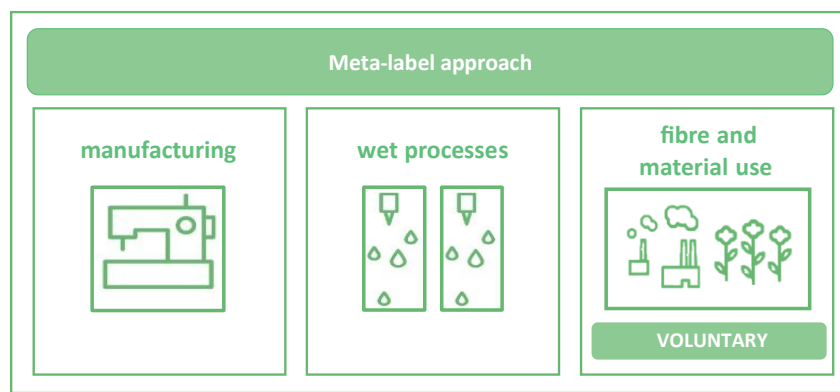


Recognised Certification Labels for the Green Button

(01/2026)

As part of the meta-label approach, the Green Button sets requirements for production processes at selected supply chain levels. Companies demonstrate compliance through recognised certification labels. Alongside the requirements for corporate due diligence processes, they are the basis for a product to be labeled with the Green Button. It is possible that further labels or recognition scopes will be added over time. In the table below the green box **GB 2.0** indicates in which supply chain levels the labels are recognised. The requirements for the “raw material extraction (fibre and material use)” level are voluntary.

Production steps that must be covered by the Green Button 2.0 meta-label approach:



The recognised certification labels listed under “Fibres/Materials” are voluntary. Certification labels for fibres and materials are not recognised in general, but only for certain fibres and materials.
